ATHLETIC ABILITY							SECTION GRADE:		6.5
Excellent short area quickness. Gets off the snap quickly and launches for a run play or backs up in a hurry to set up for a pass play. He has a good amount of playing speed but will sometimes arrive a little late to his spot on screen passes. Stanley also displays good overall strength on most plays but will sometimes get pushed back on pass plays. Also, he doesn't always show the strength / out of hands.									
RUN BLOCKING - IN-LINE / OUT IN SPACE							SECTION GRADE:		7.5
Launches quickly off the snap. Very good overall leverage. Can pull and get outside for sweeps. Can also chip a defensive linemen and get to the second level. Smart and very good overall technique. Can lock onto defenders and get a good push, but doesn't have the strength to completely dominate the defender. Also, when out in space, Stanley will sometimes struggle to find the best defender to block, so he'll either be ineffective in open space or allow a free defender to get a clean shot at the ball carrier.									
PASS BLOCKING - ON DEEP PASS DROPS AND SHORT / QUICK SETS							SECTION GRADE:		7.0
His excellent short area quickness allows him to quickly drop back and get set up to hold off the pass rusher. Stays square with the defender. Also quick in a short area to adjust for where a defender is going or mirror his movements. Great overall balance and consistently stays in control. Lacks some strength in that he will occasionally get pushed back or lose in hand fighting with the defender. Gets out in space for screen passes but sometimes will get to his spot too late. He also doesn't always keep his hands in the middle of the defender's chest. So far in 2024 Stanley has committed 2 holding penalties, and there were a few other occasions where he was grabbing underneath the shoulder pads. But certainly more often than not, Stanley holds off the defender using great technique.									
INITIAL QUICKNESS - OUT OF STANCE AND INTO BLOCKING POSITION							SECTION GRADE:		8.0
This is Stanley's strongest trait. He's smart enough to know exactly where to go right off the snap and does it quickly. He's rarely late off the snap. Post-snap, depending on the play, he'll either launch to engage the assigned defender near him, or he'll quickly move into position and set himself up to gain leverage.									
PLAYING STRENGTH / USE OF HANDS / PUNCH							SECTION GRADE:		5.5
Adequate overall strength and hand strength, but doesn't dominate defenders with his strength. Also, sometimes it's shown he'll get pushed back into the pocket on passing plays, and sometimes he'll lose in hand fighting with the defender. There were also several times in pass plays where Stanley would get his arms on the outside of the defender and grab his shoulder pads. In 4 games observed, Stanley has committed 2 holding penalties.									
MOBILITY - BLOCKING ON 2ND LEVEL / PULLING / TRAPPING							SECTION GRADE:		7.5
In this offensive scheme, Stanley is required to move a lot, whether it's through pulling, chipping the first defender and working to the second level, or quickly getting out for a screen pass. Stanley has the athleticism to accomplish all these things. Where Stanley struggles is when he needed to get all the way to one side to help on a screen pass. He just doesn't have the speed to get to the sideline in time. However, it may be may be much to ask a tackle to get out there that quickly. Stanley also sometimes has trouble figuring out where to go at the second level. This will cause him to either be ineffective in open space or allow a free defender to get a clean shot at the ball carrier.									
SMARTS / AWARENESS / COMPETITIVENESS / INTANGIBLES / TOUGHNESS							SECTION GRADE:		6.0
Smart enough to complete complex assignments, such as pulling, supporting a screen pass, or blocking at the second level. The Ravens also have this unbalanced formation in the playbook where a tight end is lined up in a traditional left tackle spot, and Stanley would line up on the right side like a tight end. Good at reading the pass rush and doesn't really allow an unblocked rusher come in on his side. Shows some leadership traits on the offensive line. Doesn't really demonstrate a mean streak.

Excellent short area quickness. Bursts immediately after the snap and gets in position. Very good change of direction, balance, and overall technique. Very smart in reading defenses and has the smarts and quickness to pull, get out for the screen, or work the second level.					Has adequate strength but not elite level strength that he'll dominate defenders. Plus, sometimes he'll lose in hand fighting or get pushed back in pass protection. Sometimes he'll also have trouble finding the right defender when he's working out in space.				
SUMMARY / BOTTOM LINE									
Very reliable offensive tackle that wins with good technique and short area quickness. He has enough strength to hold up against the best defensive linemen but will occasionally get pushed back or have trouble with hand fighting. Very smart in that he reads the pass rush and no "surprise" rushers will get past him. Also, with this offensive scheme, he's asked to do a lot of things like pulling, blocking at the second level, and getting out to support the screen pass. His contract will be up after the 2024 season, and I imagine he'll get a new, bigger contract next year with how reliable he is playing on the left side of the Baltimore offensive line.
